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THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into this 15th day of September, A.D. 1913, by and between
DELAWARE OIL COMPANY, a corporation incorporated, organized and existing under and by
virtue of the laws of the State of Delaware, the party of the first part, and GENERAL PETROLEUM
COMPANY, a corporation incorporated, organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of
the State of California, the party of the second part,

WITNESSETH:

That the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of ten dollars (\$10),
gold coin of the United States, to it in hand paid by the party of the second part, the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained and sold, conveyed and confirmed, and
by these presents does grant, bargain and sell, convey and confirm, unto the party of the second
part, its successors and assigns forever, all those certain lots, pieces or parcels of land
situate, lying and being in the County of Orange, State of California, particularly described
as follows:

1. The southwest quarter (S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$) and the west half (W. $\frac{1}{2}$) of the southeast quarter (S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$)
of Section Nine (9), Township Three (3) south, Range Ten (10) west, San Bernardino Face and
Meridian, containing two hundred and forty (240) acres, more or less.

2. The north half (N. $\frac{1}{2}$) of the Northeast quarter (N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Eight (8), and the
northwest quarter (N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$) of the northeast quarter (N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$) of section Nine (9), all in Township
Three (3) south, Range Nine (9) west, San Bernardino Face and Meridian, containing one hundred
and twenty (120) acres, more or less.

3. A portion of the Rancho Rincon de la Brea, particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the southeast corner of the Rancho Rincon de la Exea, and being Station III of the exterior boundary of said Rancho, the same being marked by a 4" x 4" post, three (3) feet high, marked "S.J.T. de S.A." on the south face, with a two-inch gas pipe driven on the north side of the said post; running thence north 85 degrees 48' west, one hundred and seven and sixteen hundredths (107.16) chains to a six inch iron casing marked "U.O.C." D. 1905, in the office of the County Recorder of the said County of Orange in Book 120 of Deeds, page 223; thence north 28 degrees 36' east, twenty-seven and three hundred and eighty-five thousandths (27.855) chains to a point in a road; thence north 69 degrees 00' east fourteen and eighty-eight hundredths (14.88) chains to a point in the center of the Arroyo del Rodeo, said point being fifty hundredths (0.50) chains west of a 4" x 4" redwood witness post marked "A" on the southeast face, "Z" on the northeast face, and "W" on the west face; thence south 29 degrees 45' east, one hundred and six and eight hundred and eleven thousandths (106.811) chains to a 2" x 4" post in rock mound marked "2" on the northeast face and "W.E." on the southwest face; thence south 00 degrees 21' east, fifty-two and thirty-four thousandths (52.034) chains to the point of commencement; containing six hundred and six and ninety-three hundredths (606.93) acres of land, and being that certain so-called 595.869 acre tract of land as the same is described in a deed from Herbert Noble et al. to Delaware Union Oil Company, dated the 14th day of April, A. Also all the right, title, claim and demand of the party of the first part in and to any and all existing leases, privileges, contracts or agreements, which in any way affect the above described lands or any parts thereof, together with all of the profits, incomes and emoluments to be derived therefrom or thereunder.
